Canadian Bar Association Military Law Award



Congratulations to Afton Maisonneuve, this year's recipient of the Sword & Scale Essay
Contest run by the Military Law Section of the Canadian Bar Association. The prize is presented annually for the best scholarly paper in Canadian military law or justice, public policy or public affairs related to Canadian military law and regulation touching on military law or national security.

Her essay "Neither Charity nor Special Treatment: Amendments to Sustainably Modernize the Canadian Forces Members and Veterans Re-establishment and Compensation Act" provides a chronological overview of important amendments to the Veteran's Charter and a discussion of future proposed amendments as well as a commentary on the practical challenges surrounding Veteran benefits.

Afton currently serves as an Infantry Reservist with the Cameron Highlanders of Ottawa. Afton will receive her award certificate on May 24 at the annual military law conference, and her paper will be published on the CBA Military Law Section webpage.

Agadem Cemetery

On Easter Sunday, the newsletter editor received the following e-mail from his step-son. In the November newsletter, individual headstones will be shown.

Ana and I are travelling around in Belgium and the Netherlands and today we drove past the Agedem Canadian-Polish cemetery from WW2 on our way to Brugges. We stopped to pay our respects and I was curious if there were any Cameron Highlanders resting there. We walked the rows and found many tombstones for "Cameron Highlanders of Ottawa" as well as Cameron Highlanders of Canada and numerous other names. I took photos of the tombstones and will send them to you. It has their rank, role, and some have inscriptions. I suspect this is all well documented/visited by the association, but I thought you might be interested and like the photos.

We also stopped by the Canada War Museum nearby and saw their collection. The majority of the exhibit focused on the Canadian forces fighting at Leopold canal and then Walcheren island, where we happened to have spent the last couple of nights. The museum was setup by a local family who attributed Canadian soldiers with saving their family during particularly heavy fighting in the area. The museum and coffee shop/dance hall was all quite eccentric, but very nice. Earlier at the cemetery we saw a grave with a bouquet of flowers from the family who setup the museum.
